• ETHICS

Citizens Union believes New York needs a sweeping overhaul of our ethics system to restore the public's faith in government. JCOPE, the agency charged with enforcing state laws regarding ethics, has been structurally burdened since its inception a decade ago. The major flaw of the JCOPE framework is the lack of independence from the Governor and political parties in the Legislature. Citizens Union supports a constitutionally established, independent ethics agency that would deter corruption in the legislative and executive branches.

• ELECTIONS AND VOTING

Election Administration

In the last few years, this legislature has made immense strides in making New York's election laws more open and fair. But in one fundamental way, our state has remained in the 1800s – the party-based control of elections through Boards of Elections. This broken system has resulted in the continued use of patronage instead of merit in hiring, gridlock in decision-making, a complete lack of accountability, exclusion of representation of minor parties, and impediments to primary challengers. Most importantly, it has damaged New Yorkers' trust in their election system. Voters experience the impact of New York's broken election administration system every year. Citizens Union supports removing the control of county political parties over election administration, professionalizing election offices and staff, and standardizing election administration across the state.

 I would support measures that maintain the integrity of our elections and support policies that would make the BOE more efficient.

First: Universal childcare and after school for all-My children are 8 and 5. COVID exposed the cracks in our system and countless women left the workforce during this time. It is crucial for parents to have the care they need for their children and as Senator, I will fight to reach universal childcare and after school for all. This will give our kids the head start they need, help them recover from the learning loss of the pandemic, and allow parents to get back to work.

Second: Public safety, criminal justice, & investing in social services- We need to prioritize safety, but in a way that ensures justice and accountability. New York State made history with landmark criminal justice reforms that were long overdue and necessary, however it was done without proper funding for social services. We need to redirect people suffering from mental health issues toward treatment instead of the criminal justice system. We must do more to invest in social services, while keeping the peace and making sure that people feel safe in their communities, while getting the guns off our streets and addressing the rise in violent crime.

Third: Housing-We must improve the living conditions for our NYCHA residents and make much needed investments to expedite repairs and improve the infrastructure in these homes. Beyond public housing, we must make it easier for people to buy a home. As Senator, I will work to increase affordable housing, particularly for families and expand incentives for first-time homebuyers to prevent people from leaving New York City.

• If elected, what is the first piece of legislation you would want to introduce? If you are an incumbent, what is the first piece of legislation you would want to pass?

My brother has a chronic disability which requires both physical and occupational therapy. Insurance companies often treat therapy similarly to if someone was using it as rehab post some kind of surgery, only covering a certain amount of sessions. Chronic disabilities require lifelong PT/OT, which should be covered and recognized by insurance companies. I would introduce legislation which would require insurance companies to cover these services for people with chronic disabilities.

- In providing constituent service, what are the major needs of your district's constituents and how will you meet them?
 The needs of the district range from assistance with day-to-day needs like access to food and housing to the long term recovery of homes and neighborhood infrastructure systems from Hurricane Ida. I will meet people where they're at to address any and all issues because what matters to my constituents, matters to me.
