

Many residents are unaware of the resources available to them through the Assembly office, so I will also run outreach campaigns to reach even the most disenfranchised citizen.

Subsequently in my roles as an advocate, I lobbied for additional resources for state and local agencies to better support workers in administering key programs that provide essential social services to New Yorkers.

To achieve this number, I plan to target specific groups in my ground strategy and canvassing efforts. Specific groups for activation include voters with a history of turning out for primary races, the pro-housing voters and renters, female voters, Jewish voters, younger voters and students registered in the district. In addition, through an organized ground-level outreach strategy, I'll seek to encourage and activate voters of color and NYCHA residents especially in the northern half of the district to turnout, messaging that previous representatives have not delivered for these communities.

I have currently raised approximately \$35,000. My goal is to raise \$50,000 by the 3/15 fundraising deadline and aim for \$150,00 for the race overall.
