What are your top three campaign promises or goals, and what action will you take to achieve them if elected?



First: Housing - As an Assemblymember, I will secure truly affordable housing, invest in Harlem's public housing complexes, protect renters through legislation like Good Cause Eviction, and ensure everyone has a place to live that they can afford. Furthermore, I will support the Tenant Opportunity to Purchase Act to give tenants an opportunity to become owners of their homes.

Second: Education - We need to fully fund our schools, invest in our libraries, and advocate for tuition-free CUNY and SUNY because every student should have access to quality education. I also support smaller class sizes, placing a cap on charter schools, greater investment in our public school system, the Solutions not Suspensions Act, and ending mayoral control so the education system is in the hands of parents, educators, and students.

Third: Healthcare - As an Assemblymember I will fight to pass the New York Health Act so that everyone can access healthcare at no cost. Collaborate with community members and groups to address the homelessness and mental health crises, so they receive the support they need. The win number depends largely on the number of candidates on the ballot. Therefore, depending on that, the win number is between 5,000 - 7,000 votes. I have already obtained more than 5,000 votes in my 2022 State Committee race and we have a growing base of support in Harlem through my organizing, getting more people involved in the democratic process. As a result, we've had great responses from people and they are excited about having a progressive in Albany that will fight for Harlem. We will make this happen through our groundwork and a diverse set of voter contact.

As of our last January disclosure we have raised more money than any other candidate in the race with over \$35k. We are the only campaign to have qualified for matching funds and have qualified for nearly \$100k. Our goal is to continue fundraising until we max out on matching funds.

As of the last January disclosure we are the campaign with the most individual donors (in general) and in-district district. With around 350 donors in general, and close to 150 in-district donors.
