What is your opinion on the recently passed ethics reform, which replaced JCOPE with a new ethics oversight agency called Commission on Ethics and Lobbying in Government? Did you support this policy?

I serve on the Ethics Committee and attended a hearing in Albany which provided oversight on JCOPE. I came to the conclusion that it was time to replace JCOPE with a new agency that was accountable and transparent. The change was made in the budget. I am optimistic because the law school deans are reviewing applications and using their insights to carefully determine qualifications rather than rubberstamp nominees.

That's why I supported legislation to expand early voting, improve the absentee ballot process. Results must be recorded accurately and in a timely manner. GOALS, PLANS, AND REPRESENTATION

What are the top three campaign promises or goals, and what action will you take to achieve them if elected? Feel free to reference an answer above rather than restate it.

First: Gun violence. While I am proud to have supported legislation to strengthen gun laws, I am certain that we can do more to limit firearm violence

Second: Women's rights are under assault across the country. The Supreme Court's decision to repeal Roe v. Wade has had a crippling effect on a woman's right to bodily autonomy. We must work to ensure that a woman's rights are protected in NYS. In addition, we must protect our health care professions from liability and from those States which limit abortions. We must protect the State's address confidentiality program. I will always fight to ensure that every New Yorker has access to the reproductive care they need. Lastly, we must allow pharmacies to provide medication to those who request it.

Third: As chairwoman of the Higher Education Committee, I am proud of the increased funding for colleges and universities. There have been no tuition increases since I became Chairwoman and CUNY and SUNY have received unprecedented support. I hope to see the elimination of all fees, reductions in tuition and improvements in enrollments, especially at community colleges

If elected, what is the first piece of legislation you would want to introduce? If you are an incumbent, what is the first piece of legislation you would want to pass?

I will work to pass legislation that eliminates fees at all CUNY and SUNY institutions in NYS, reduce tuition rates and find ways to increase enrollment.

In providing constituent service, what are the major needs of your district's constituents and how will you meet them?

People need help in navigating government. I currently have staff fluent in four languages. The major areas constituents seek help are: local issues, personal problems, requests for information and information on legislative issues.

What experience have you had, if any, with good government and reform issues? (e.g. voting and elections, campaign finance, ethics, government transparency and oversight, police accountability). If you've worked to advance these goals, we'd love to hear about it.

Many, many years ago, I served on the Citizen's Union's committee on City Council legislation, evaluating the bills. I was also active at that time with the League of Women Voters. More recently I have worked with NYPD on their Explorer's program,

which works with neighborhood young people. I have also served on task forces to attract more women to government, especially the courts. For a long time, lack of diversity among judges has been an important issue.

Do you currently live in this district? How long have you lived in it?

Yes, I reside in Whitestone and my son attended local schools in community district 25

For incumbents: If your district has changed significantly following this year's redistricting, how do you intend to run your office to serve the needs of the new constituents you now represent?

In District 11, 98% is new. The Special Master drew lines that stretch from the Bronx (Rikers Island) to the Nassau County line. My colleagues have been introducing me to their communities and constituents. I am attending town halls and civic association meetings to get to understand the issues.

PATH TO VICTORY

I plan to wage an active campaign as I have always done. People know that I understand the issues, whether they be state or local, that I can accomplish many things and that I care about my constituents.
